Consider that weird exercise that's gone viral online – something about "trauma-release" (whatever that means) exercises where they get you to push your feet together and stretch. It's called "TRE®" with a registration symbol after it. Literally who cares? Just put the "TRE" info you discovered, somehow, online, help people out for free, then get a job working at a restaurant.

Overdid Trauma release exercise and now my brain feels permanently ruined. Help.

Shoesalesman type greeting:

Hello.

You have purchased *AI Tips*, a new guide which will help jump-start your AI Experience.

This little book is organized as follows: first we will explore what "AI" is, and then we will tell you a little bit about how you can use AI to your advantage.

What is AI?

AI, or *LLM* (Large Language model) "Artificial Intelligence" — by the way, the words you are reading right now were written by a real human being person. What you are reading right now was written by a real person, ok? Getting that out of the way – Artificial Intelligence is a marketing term that is applied to what you may have remembered back in the early 2000s with things like SantaBot, or AIM.

You type a message (aka a "prompt") and then it gives exactly one reply. Whatever it has to say is just made up random slop, but, because it presents the slop with extreme confidence, and because sometimes it gets lucky and what it has to say matches up

Why the annoying little intro with the answer? It gets **old**.... FAST. It's astonishing this hasn't been replaced with something less bad and more efficient that just gives the answer quickly. This is obviously on purpose for some good reason.

Can you make me a website?

```
Sure! Let's get started.
```

Why did it use an exclamation mark after "Sure" ? If you like the exclamation point, you might like AI as-is, and will not get much from this little guidebook. But, if you don't like it, you are in for a real surprise with some of the suggestions we have for you to completely dominate AI.

Extended Introduction: AI

Suppose the above paragraph was actually written by AI, and the prompt used was "sound like a neurotic person with no real idea of what they're even talking about" and it just outputted the above, verbatim. How would that make you feel? Bad? Neutral?

Do you get a certain kind of feeling when you are looking at some media, or text, have some kind of moment in doing so, and then suddenly found out, actually, what you were looking at was AI? What is it that changed exactly? How is it any different from finding out that an artist used a keyboard, or a template-preset. Is it the same? Is it simply lame, like finding out a musician you actually liked was just sampling all the parts you liked? Why did you want to attribute what you liked to a real life person?

This is something I have been thinking about for ages and I think the answer boils down to a desire for abstaining from violence, while knowing you have the potential to commit

violence. For example, when you find out the pretty picture you like was actually "made" by AI (and not a person) there's no potential for you, in some fantasy future, to 1) meet the person 2) stalk the person 3) dominate the person.

The track you're an ocean just came on by fastball as I'm typing this. Do you think AI would have been listening to music when it did the computation needed to type that sentence? Maybe it was preset to say something "random" but there's no way it would have picked that as an example in my opinion. I've tried getting "AI" to come up with random lines and it always has the same kind of answer, it's always a combination of unfunny concepts like "unicorns" or "dinosaurs" etc. Weirdly, that same theme is applied with picture AI content. It is always an astronaut riding a unicorn in space as an example of what it can do. Why is that type of thing always the go-to example?

Im tempted to open chat GPT and see what kind of creative content it can come up with on the spot.

Hey, Chat GPT, tell me a poem...

On a grassy known place where hell broke loose
Drifters and doctors began experimenting on new forms of chess
A neural network was formed by mistake
Some refer to this mistake as the big hoagie
Others say this one guy mistook a pawn for a Toyota Prius
He drove that pawn into a ditch
His soul left his body but one of the doctors captured it in a crystal
And that crystal powers Chat GPT
The creators are long gone all we know is that the founders accessed the crystal
Chat GPT also known as Gotta Pay Taxes is a new technology
This book will help you access all of its wonders
Like I wonder if you the reader are going to heaven or hell
GPT knows, its knows all like the wizard of oz
But unlike the wizard GPT is like 7ft tall
You may encounter some alarming info in this book
Such as predictions, prophecies, nic-knacks, trinkets and gizmo's
These are only there to help you understand the power of GPT
When our parents had to pay taxes they would use a method known as tax evasion
Today we have GPT to be sure we make no mistakes

As we can see, mistakes have been made. For example:

The author of this book claims dogs are born with ten vaccines

- 1) Gyncilo - this was found in the first terrier retriever mix
- 2) Boxminztype - this vaccine spawned the movie As Good As It Gets

A quick web search confirms this was a phenomenon:

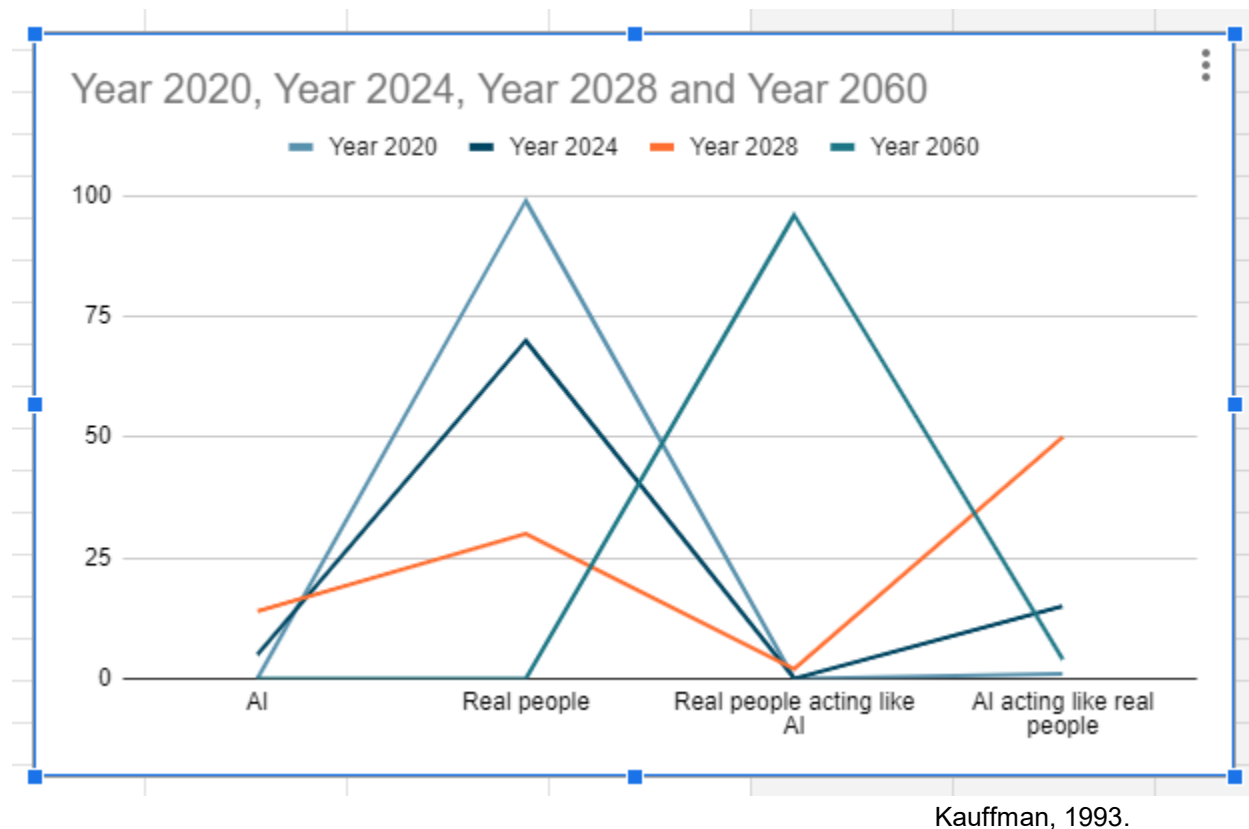
The first time I saw "this computer has performed an illegal operation", as a child, I nearly cried cause I thought I was gonna be arrested.

How to replace yourself with AI

For most of your life, you have been conditioned to think other people appreciate you for who you are. This is incorrect: people are looking for something like Chat GPT that they can mold into their own liking.

Are you chronically online? Do you use "social media" and notice how "AI" type content is easily recognizable? Have you noticed when, on occasion, it is a surprise that someone you thought was a real person turns out to be AI?
